




UIUC and SIUC are the only public universities that are more than 50% male undergraduates. Nearly two-thirds of undergraduates at GSU are female.

Undergraduates Gender






Institutions like GSU, CSU, NEIU, and UIS have a largely adult undergraduate population—those over age 25.




Institutions that serve large percentages of adult learners also have high proportions of students attending part-time, including GSU at nearly 40%

Among Illinois public universities, GSU enrolls one of the highest numbers of student parents along with one of the highest proportions at 18.3%


Student Parent Status among Undergradautes at Illinois Public Universities






Transfer students are a significant proportion of <u>new</u> undergraduates at most institutions and comprise over three-quarters of the new students at GSU which is the highest % in the state.


New Students and Transfer Status



NEIU and ISU have the highest proportion of full-time freshmen from Illinois public high schools, over 85%. GSU is above 80%.

Distribution of New Full-Time Freshmen by High School Type



Nearly 50% of full-time freshmen from Illinois public high schools are from the least funded school districts (Tier 1). At GSU, over four-fifths met that distinction


Distribution of New Full-Time Freshmen by the Funding Adequacy of their Illinois Public High School





At UIUC, over 60% of incoming freshmen had GPAs above 3.5, while at slightly more than 20% at NEIU did. GSU has the second smallest percentage at 23%

High School GPA Distribution for Incoming Freshmen in Fall of AY2021-22 by Illinois Public University








Latinx undergraduate enrollments have increased at GSU since 2013, while enrollment of White students has declined




While overall African American undergraduate enrollment dropped by 22.3% since 2013, some institutions increased, led by ISU.

Change in African American Undergraduate Enrollment: 2013 to 2022




Overall Latinx enrollments increased by 40% with some variation across the public universities, with GSU increasing by 58%

Change in Latinx Undergraduate Enrollment: 2013 to 2022







GSU has decreased completions for African Americans and Whites, with Latinx completions up



African American completions are down over 10% from 2013 with five of the Illinois public universities experiencing increases




Latinx undergraduate completions have increased by two-thirds from 2013




A look at African American students



GSU enrolls over three times the percentage of African Americans as public universities overall and the share is growing



Recent large declines in retention and advancement among African Americans and whites at GSU.







Retention and Advancement of New First-Time Full-Time

Most institutions <u>graduate</u> African Americans who started as *freshmen* at low rates. All graduate African Americans at rates lower than whites. GSU is below the state rate but has a smaller gap than the median.


% of African Americans graduated within 6 years and gap to whites



GSU more likely to retain and advance African American transfer students than freshmen, but gaps with whites remain particularly with advancement.




Retention and Advancement of New Transfer Full-Time Students at All Illinois Public Universities

Overall, public universities graduate African American transfer students at rates below whites. GSU is below the statewide rate and has the largest gap with whites.

% African American Transfers Graduated and Gap to Whites






A look at Latinx students




GSU has increased Latinx share of undergraduate enrollment and parallels the statewide share






No gaps between Latinx and White freshmen, but both groups experienced large year over year declines in retention and advancement.



GSU has a relatively low graduation rate among Latinx freshmen, but no gap with their white peers.






GSU retains and advances more Latinx transfer students than freshmen, with no retention gap, but advancement gap recently widened




Retention and Advancement of New Full-Time Transfer Students at all Illinois Public Universities





GSU graduates higher rates of Latinx transfer students. Slightly less than half of Latinx transfer students at GSU graduate within four years with a large gap.







A look at low-income students




About half of the Pell and MAP recipients at GSU are African American




Low-income students comprise more than half of GSU's undergraduates, but the proportion has decreased slightly since 2013.




GSU retains low-income freshmen at higher rates than non-low-income freshmen, but small advancement gap remains with large recent declines.






Retention and Advancement of New First-Time Full-Time Students By Pell Status at All Illinois Public Universities





Nearly all of the public universities <u>graduate</u> low-income *freshmen* at rates 20% below non-low-income freshmen. At GSU only a quarter of low-income freshmen graduate with a small gap.


% Low-Income Freshmen Graduates with Gap to Non-Low-Income







Low-income transfers have higher rates of retention than their non-low-income peers along with similar rates of advancement.






Retention and Advancement of New Full-Time Transfer Students By Pell Status at All Illinois Public Universities





Institutions graduate low-income transfer students at rates on average -5% below non-low-income. GSU graduates nearly half of low-income transfers and they perform better than their non-lowincome counterparts.

% Low-Income Transfer Graduated and Gap with Non-Low-Income






A look at outcomes for students in graduate and professional programs




About a third of graduate students at GSU are African American and another third are white. All race/ethnicity groups have a solid female majority except international students.

Large completion gap between African American master's students and their white counterparts at GSU. More African American non-completers are still enrolled at the end of the tracking period.
