

## Associate of Applied Science - Criminal Justice Services to Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Prairie State College (PSC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Criminal Justice degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Criminal Justice Services degree from PSC and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree in Criminal Justice from GSU.

Student must complete at least 1 hour of 3000/4000 level coursework.
