Associate in Applied Science in Criminal Justice to Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Waubonsee Community College (WCC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Criminal Justice degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree from WCC and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree in Criminal Justice from GSU.
