Associate in Applied Science in Criminal Justice: Public Police Services to Bachelor in Arts in Criminal Justice

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Criminal Justice degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree in Criminal Justice: Public Police Services from one of the CCC and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree in Criminal Justice from GSU.
