Eligibility

This program is open to GSU undergraduate and graduate students. Priority is given to students in the College of Business who plan to take the course for credit.

Application Procedure

Students can start applying as soon as possible. Their applications will be reviewed in the order they are received. Once you meet the study abroad requirements, all applicant names will be sent to the faculty leaders for final approval.

- 1. Study Abroad Appointment Make an appointment with Study Abroad Coordinator, Amy Schoenberg <u>aschoenberg@govst.edu</u>, and request the Study Abroad Application packet.
- 2. COB Application & Study Abroad Application Form Submit application forms and other required documents at your earliest convenience to the Office of International Services, GMT Building, Room 151. Please note that the COB Application requires you to put down your deposit via credit card or by attaching a check or money order.
- Deposit Once your application has been reviewed and you receive acceptance, the program fee will be set up on your student account and your deposit will be applied to your program fee. (Application and deposit are due by <u>11/10/2017</u>, but you are encouraged to submit the application and deposit early.)
- 4. Study Abroad Scholarship If you choose to apply for the scholarship, submit your application and accompanying documents to Amy Schoenberg (<u>aschoenberg@govst.edu</u>) located in GMT 151

by 11/15/2017 or 2/15/18. Application and instructions are inside the Study Abroad Application packet.

- 5. Financial Aid Check with the Financial Aid office to find out the possibility of using your financial aid funds/loans toward the course tuition and program expenses. Contact: Matthew Zarris (mzarris@govst.edu). The Federal Pell grant should be available in Summer 2018.
- 6. Course Registration Register for MGMT 5000, MGMT 3000 or PADM 8000 (either for credit or audit). Please note that auditing may require the assistance of the professor and costs \$75.
- 7. **Passport** Apply for passport ASAP if you don't have one already. Make sure your passport is valid for at least 6 months past your date of departure from Europe. Submit a copy to OIS.
- 8. Visa No visa is required for U.S. citizens. If you are not a U.S. citizen, please visit travel.state.org to see what the requirements are.
- 9. Vaccinations No vaccinations are required but you should stay up to date with routine vaccines.

Note: All money paid to GSU is non-refundable. Once you commit to the program, you are expected to cover the program cost.

Scholarships & Grants:

- 1. <u>IU CIBER GRANT</u> Indiana University Center for International Business and Research grant will award \$600 for the first 15 students who make the first two payments (\$1500) by 12/15/2017.
- 2. STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIP Students may apply for the GSU Study Abroad Scholarship. Instructions are found at the second half of the Study Abroad Application packet located on the website. Awards are typically between \$500-750. The deadlines to apply for the scholarship are November 15, 2017 and February 15, 2018.
