- 1. Graduate Application
- 2. \$50 Application Fee
- 3. Current Resume
- 2 Letters of Recommendation (sealed) (e.g. current or former college faculty member, current or former work supervisor, or community leader)
- 5. Statement of Intent (Discuss personal short- and long-term career goals, reasons for pursuing an MPA degree at this time and what about this particular program is going to help reach those goals. Please give specific personal examples of leadership and provide other pertinent information to help the committee select candidates who can benefit from and contribute to the program. The statement of intent offers applicants the opportunity to demonstrate writing and communication skills and supports candidacy for the MPA degree)

Note: Typically applicants will be expected to have a 3.0 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale in their last 60 hours to be considered for admission into the MPA program
