Why get a Master of Arts in Educational Administration – Principal Leadership?

School administrators are crucial for student success. Teachers who are inspired to become leaders of their fields will learn the skills needed as principal to advance a school's organization by establishing a successful curriculum, proficient instructors, and academically prepared students.

Data collected in 2018 reflected the national median salary for school principals to be **\$105,072** with an average range of \$92,803 – \$118,200 (salary.com). Chicago's median salary for principals is **\$111,925**.

Delivery Format

Governors State's 36-credit hour Principal Leadership M.A. is offered in a cohort format fully on-campus and hybrid format OR off-site district partner sites. Some courses are delivered in an online format. The cohort model allows you to take two classes per term but in 7.5 week sessions to allow for no more than one class to be meeting at a time.

Admission Requirements:

- A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university
- Good standing at last institution attended
- Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions (demonstrating a fulfillment of the above three items) submitted to the Office of Admissions and Student Recruitment
- Currently teaching
- Professional Educator License (PEL) in Illinois
- A non-refundable \$50 application fee
