

The Latino Scholarship is open to Governors State University students who meet the criteria below. The scholarship award is \$1000.00, (\$500.00 per semester), annually and will be given \$750.00 per semester, for books at GSU Bookstore. The deadline for submitting applications is July 1st for the year and October 1 for the Spring Semester.

Criteria

- At least one parent must be of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central American, South American or of other Latino ancestry regardless of race.
- ▲ Must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours per semester.
- Must be admitted to a degree seeking program at GSU.

Initial Application Procedures

- Applicants must complete application.
- The applicant must submit a personal statement that is no more than two type-written pages (double space) describing a brief statement explaining the applicant's financial need and: 1) the applicant's academic and professional goals and how receiving this scholarship will help him/her achieve those goals; 2) a description of the applicant's community service and/or extracurricular activities; and 3) how his/her leadership skills will help increase the Latino student involvement on campus.
- The application must include two letters of recommendation from persons who are knowledgeable about the applicant's academic potential and/or professional demeanor.
- \checkmark The applicant must be admitted to GSU by the scholarship application deadline.
- The applicant, (if reapplying), must provide proof that he/she is enrolled for a minimum of 12 credit hours.
- Completed applications must be submitted to the Latino Scholarships Committee no later than July 1 for Fall Semester or October 1 for Spring Semester.

Obligations of the Scholarship Recipient

If you are a past-recipient of this scholarship you must:

- Maintain a cumulative 3.0 or higher each semester;
- Maintain enrollment in at least six credit hours per semester;
- Be an active participant in a GSU club or organization;
- As a Latino student leader you must plan and implement one student campus activity;
- Submit a copy of your class schedule within the first week of classes starting each semester;
- Be in good academic standing

Failure to meet any of the above obligations may result in scholarship recipient losing his/her scholarship.
