## Transfer Guide for Associate in Arts Criminal Justice, 2010-2011

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Morton and GSU for the Criminal Justice degree program based on the 2010-11 catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate in Arts (AA) degree from Morton College (MC) and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree in Criminal Justice from Governors State University (GSU).
