## Transfer Guide for Associate of Applied Science In Physical Therapy Assistant to Interdisciplinary Studies Bachelors of Arts Program, Preparing for Doctorate in Physical Therapy Program 2010-2011

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Morton College and Governors State University (GSU) for the Interdisciplinary Studies degree program based on the 2010-11 catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree from Morton College and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree from the Interdisciplinary Studies Program from GSU. **This will prepare student for the physical therapy program but does not guarantee admission to the Doctorate in Physical Therapy Program.**
