

Elementary and Middle School Education

General Education Requirement for Teacher Licensure, Initial Elementary Certificate

The following is an outline of General Education course work that is required for Elementary Education majors at Governors State University. The courses listed in each category are Moraine Valley Community College courses that may be transferred to meet GSU requirements. Courses with grades below "C" will not be accepted toward the degree.

Thus, of the 18-19 hours required for this specialization, 11 hours may come from a combination of GE and PE course work.

In consultation with a program advisor, students will select at least 18 - 19 hours of coursework within one of the following teaching specializations. <u>At least 9 hours must be completed at the upper-division level.</u> **Transferable MVCC courses are shown in bold.**
