

15. Budget Narrative

Provide a brief narrative of the resource requirements included in the Budget Table.

No additional state funding will be required. One new faculty member will be needed to accommodate the students enrolled in the GSU program in the first two years. An additional faculty member will be needed in years two and three. These increases will match the structure of Northern Illinois University’s and Southern Illinois University’s programs. As previously noted, this program will provide certain courses that NIU and SIU-C do not include in their doctoral sequence, and also provide an alternative to students who live in the GSU area and would like to pursue a doctoral degree. Teaching loads of faculty are not expected to be different from NIU’s and SIU-C’s structure, and the current faculty loads will not change if the additional faculty lines are secured as planned.

The cost of hiring new faculty members can be managed by way of offering a differential tuition for students expected to enter into the program in cohorts of ten (see Tables 3-9). Counseling and counseling-related programs compared between SIU-C, NIU and GSU as of 2005 indicated that GSU’s cost per credit hour were less than NIU’s and SIU-C’s. However, SIU-C and NIU still increased their costs per credit hours in order to maintain their upper division programs. Governors State University is in a position to double or at least differentially increase the cost per credit hour for its Ed.D. program and still be reasonably below the costs of the programs at these other institutions. Support for this assertion can be located within the State of Illinois Board of Higher Education 2004-05 Program Major Course of Study.

16. Facilities and Equipment

Describe the facilities and equipment available to develop and maintain a quality program including buildings, classrooms, laboratories and equipment, clinical sites, office space, and library resources.

In terms of available classroom space and laboratory settings, the Division of Psychology and Counseling has recently established a state-of-the-art counseling lab available for individual, group, couples and child counseling. Students will have access to high quality video and audio recording materials that will allow for careful review of their clinical work. Resources are also available for teaching/instruction as well as clerical duties that must be performed in order to provide appropriate counseling services to the public. Some of the doctoral courses will be offered during the day, a time when classroom utilization is lower than in the evenings.

Library Services at Governors State University will be an important part of supporting the evidence-based practice emphasized in the Ed.D. program in Counselor Education and Supervision. The online resources which allow access to PDF articles as well as various capstone projects and theses are expected to serve as integral parts to the capstone

project and evidence-based practice process. In terms of available journals and peer-reviewed scholarly materials, the GSU library houses many of these documents on site.

The Division of Psychology and Counseling is assigned a reference librarian to take care of our book and journal ordering, as well as to help our students and faculty with their research needs. This individual compiled a list of journals available in our library or electronically that relate to counseling and mental health in general. This list includes almost 600 journals. In addition, according to our library catalog, we have over 2000 books and over 150 videos related to counseling. The library resources should be adequate to meet the scholarly needs of doctoral students.

17. Faculty and Staff

Describe the personnel resources available to develop and maintain a quality program including faculty (full- and part-time, current and new), staff (full- and part-time, current and new), and the administrative structure that will be in place to oversee the program. The Division of Psychology and Counseling has 22 full-time faculty (11 specifically in Counseling) and a Division Chairperson who is required to teach at least 1 course a year. In addition, the Division has 1 administrative assistant, 1 office manager, and 2 advisors. The Division is also assisted by 8 graduate assistants and 4 tuition waiver students. Oversight of the program is done by the chairperson, the program coordinator, and the advisor. The entire Division is overseen by the Dean of the College of Education. The College has two divisions: The Division of Psychology and Counseling, and the Division of Education.

Faculty evaluation and compensation/reward structure is set by Union Contract and University rules. Faculty are evaluated on teaching, research, and service. Teaching is evaluated by reviews of syllabi, student evaluations, and observation. Research is evaluated based on the number and type of publications, presentations, research projects, and grants. Service is evaluated based on being involved with program, department, college, university, and professional activities and roles. Examples would include committee membership, volunteer work, editorial boards, and holding offices in professional organizations. Evaluation of these areas is used for retention, tenure, promotion, professional advancement, and excellence awards. Faculty can earn additional compensation through excellence awards and by earning Credit Unit Equivalents (CUEs) beyond their contract negotiated rate (24-27 for tenure track faculty and 30-33 for non-tenure track faculty). Additional CUEs can be earned through special assignments, scholarship, teaching extra courses, and filling extra professional duties (e.g. program coordinator or counseling lab coordinator). In addition, faculty are awarded extra CUEs for serving on masters capstone projects and will be given extra CUEs (.3 CUEs) for serving on a doctoral capstone project defense.

Faculty and staff will provide several support services for doctoral students. Parallel to the masters program, the administrative assistant and office manager help manage student questions, scheduling, and supervising graduate assistants. The counseling advisor will assist with doctoral admissions, advising, and program planning. Faculty will do professional mentorship and guide students through the comprehensive exam, internship, and capstone project process. Students will sign up for capstone project credit with their faculty mentor/advisor.

The faculty in the Division of Psychology and Counseling are all strong professionals and academicians. Several of the Counseling faculty are nationally and internationally known. One of our faculty, Jon Carlson has been awarded the highest honors in both the fields of counseling and psychology. Through a \$1,000,000 contract with the American Psychological Association, Dr. Carlson brings in experts from the fields of counseling, psychology, social work, and marriage and family therapy to tape an expert series in GSU's state-of-the-art studio. In addition, several of the faculty have published books this past year, published articles, and presented nationally and internationally. Their accomplishments in publishing and presenting are in conjunction with a focus on excellence in teaching. The faculty receive excellent evaluations, the division faculty and advisors often receive excellence awards from the university, and are active in supporting the student graduate groups. In addition, the faculty have presented and published with masters students.
