The information is usually a year old. The site allows you to find the salaries for all employees in a district. When you get the list, if you click on "Salary", it will order the salaries in descending or ascending order. If you select a name, it will give you the salary, position, full/part time, assignment, years teaching, degrees and name of the school and district.
