What is a SEEDS Peer Mentor?

The SEEDS Peer Mentor is a Governors State University student who provides guidance to Learning Community Cohort (LCC) students from Morton College. Peer mentors assist in achieving the goal of the Title V Cooperative Peer Mentor Program which is to increase student persistence and degree completion. SEEDS Mentors will contact, communicate, encourage, advise and guide three LCC students. Each mentor will serve as a role model and will help LCC students in making the transition to college life.

What are the requirements?

- Currently enrolled at Governors State University, with a minimum of 60 credit hours completed (status as a Junior or Senior).
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- Have a desire to work, network and guide LCC students currently enrolled at Morton College.
- Must be able to attend monthly meetings at Morton College and/or GSU on Fridays at noon.
- Must have access to internet and phone.

What are the benefits?

- Peer mentoring experience added to your résumé.
- \$1000 annual stipend.
- Opportunity to network, guide and learn from others.

How can I become a SEEDS Peer Mentor?

- You must fill out and submit a completed application to the Title V Cooperative Grant at Morton College. Applications can be found at GSU, Latino Center for Excellence, Office A2133.
- Upon submission of completed application, you will receive a call to schedule a one-on-one interview with the selection committee to be conducted at Morton College.
