

Associate in Arts to Bachelor of Social Work

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Social Work degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate in Arts (AA) degree from one of the CCC and a Bachelors of Social Work (BSW) degree from GSU. **In addition to meeting the GSU admission criteria, students must have a grade point average of at least 2.25 for the last 60 hours of undergraduate course work attempted.**
