

Associate in Arts to Bachelor in Arts in Anthropology and Sociology

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Waubonsee Community College (WCC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Anthropology and Sociology degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from WCC and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree in Anthropology and Sociology from GSU.

An additional sociological theories course and an advanced statistics course is highly recommended for students concentrating in Sociology seeking graduate level sociology training.
