# **Transfer Guide**



# Associate of Arts to Bachelor of Arts in Communication

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Communications degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate in Arts (AA) degree from one of the CCC and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree in Communications from GSU.
