Program Teri Cain	<p>Overview of the Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC) II Dept. Human Services grant program. SISAA/Human Service Center is one of 3 new grantees this year. The Human Service Center is the fiscal agent. The purpose is to create a community that is supportive of people in recovery. This will increase the opportunities for successful access to treatment and recovery. Stigma regarding drug misuse is a major barrier for people in need of treatment and support. Decreasing Stigma and increasing community support will help people get the services and support they need and improve their outcomes in recovery.</p> <p>In the first year of their ROSC grant Egyptian has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Built a strong council</li> <li>• Completed community needs assessment</li> <li>• Provided addiction disease education</li> <li>• Opened Recovery Resource Center</li> <li>• Developed strategic plan addressing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Housing</li> <li>• Employment</li> <li>• Number &amp; variety of recovery groups</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>Judge Emge asked how they address delays in getting people to treatment. 	<p>will also hire a person with lived experience who will recruit and engage people in need of treatment and recovery.</p> <p>There is a state meeting of all the current grantees on Nov 4 &amp; 5 where Kendra and Dennis will learn much more about grant requirements and expectations.</p>	
Vaping Angie	<p>The Randolph County Health Dept. is working to create vaping educational resources for schools, parents and adults.</p> <p>Students at the Teen Summit noted high rates of vaping. They are working to address this among their peers through the plans they made at the Teen Summit. Okawville HS is bringing in a program to address vaping.</p> <p>SISAA prevention lessons address vaping at grades 7 and 8 and 9<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> grades. Tasha Morrow of Hoyleton addresses vaping at middle schools in Washington County except for Nashville.</p> <p>Matt Bierman pointed out that vaping materials are easily obtained online.</p>	By 10-30 Dennis will schedule work group re vaping.
RALI Rosette	<p>The parent education trailer at the Sparta Housing Authority on Sat. 10-12 was high quality. The retired police officers delivering the program were very informative. About 25 people participated. State Rep. Reitz and Sparta Police Officers attended. Rosette felt that it would have been better if more local officials attended. When it was suggested that we do this again, Dennis shared that RALI canceled 2 dates agreed to and moved the Sparta program to another date. They also contacted Rep. Reitz late in the process to sponsor the program. This created awkwardness as RALI produced a flyer and ad with Rep. Reitz photo, our logo and did not involve other elected officials who are SISAA supporters. We did our own flyer separately from RALI. Because of the conflicts staff advised not using this resource again.</p>	
Marijuana advocacy Rosette & John	<p>Rosette also attended the Sparta City Council meeting where Assit. Chief of Police Jeremy Kempfer presented the coalition position paper. Jeremy was professional and effective. Rosette spoke with one council member who is for opting out and she thinks others might do so as well if they hear from people who support opting out.</p> <p>John attended the Chester City Committee meeting addressing marijuana along with Marc Kiehna and Dennis. John observed that some council members seem to feel that there is no option other than to allow retail sales, as it will be available anyway, so why not. Dennis commented that</p>	

	<p>reducing access is an effective prevention strategy even if marijuana is available to some degree.</p> <p>Judge Emge observed that Chester may be influenced by the opportunity to sell to Missouri residents and obtain revenue in that way.</p>	
Staff Sharon & Dennis	<p>Sharon noted that 27 students from 7 high schools attended the Teen Summit. It was very good; students enjoyed it and created prevention plans for their schools. Riley Blythe the Operation Snowball speaker was very good and energized the students.</p> <p>Sharon is also working on a Town Hall in Washington County.</p> <p>Dennis led a prevention lesson training for Randolph County teachers recently. The returning teachers were very positive about the lessons. They said that the curriculum is easy to use and the students enjoy it. There are activities which make it fun.</p> <p>We are presenting our own in plain sight at Evansville Attendance Center this Thursday 10-17 330PM - 630PM.</p> <p>We are working with Chester Schools to possibly do in plain sights next week.</p> <p>Dennis is working to follow up on scheduling a work group to address Vaping &amp; Support groups. This is in response to last month's program by Adam Guebert. Coalition members identified a need for these based on Adam's program.</p>	<p>By 10/23 Dennis will work with Tymera to schedule a Youth Committee meeting.</p> <p>By 10-18 Dennis will confirm with Chester Schools re program.</p> <p>By 10-30 Dennis will schedule a vaping &amp; support work group meeting</p>
