<p>Chester Marijuana discussion</p>	<p>Dennis noted that his role is limited to providing information to support the plans and actions of the coalition. As a person paid by federal grant funds, he cannot lobby government officials regarding legislation. The previous efforts of 11 coalition volunteers regarding opting out of legal retail/recreational marijuana was important and is allowed by our funding source. Continuing that standard is important now.</p> <p>Other coalitions have done the following to address the issue.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Zoning and advertising restrictions 2. Portion of local taxes designated to things like prevention, treatment, recovery, health care, law enforcement & schools. <p>It is important to have ongoing communication with other local units of government as they face economic/budget pressure about the false financial benefits of retail marijuana.</p> <p>There was doubt about the Chester Council accepting the idea of designating Marijuana tax funds to things other than Law Enforcement.</p> <p>Shea suggested that we explore how much to ask for IABH and CADCA.</p>	<p>By 9-28 Dennis will ask CADCA and IABH re guidance for estimating a portion of tax revenue to request.</p>
