# Associate in Applied Science in Nursing to Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Waubonsee Community College (WCC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Nursing degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in Nursing from WCC and a Bachelors of Science (BSN) degree in Nursing from GSU. **Students are required to have a minimum GPA of 2.0 for admission to the program. The BSN degree is offered at GSU completely online.**
