

# Associate in Arts to Bachelor of Science in Information Technology

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Waubonsee Community College (WCC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Information Technology degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from WCC and a Bachelors of Science (BS) degree in Information Technology from GSU.
