Recruiting more members for the council, needed from all sectors of the community Internal Communication plan: Best way to communicate is in-person meetings but if not possible via email and Zoom o 2-3 days waiting for email response, then call Share ROSC contact list at every meeting announcement/reminder o 60% needed for consensus. If absent from decision, email will be sent and no reply by set deadline (i.e., 24 hours) will be counted as agreement. Consensus requirement will be discussed every 6 months Create shared Dropbox or one drive for all consortium members to access

Objectives:

- o Increase partnership value to the Consortium by connecting agencies and members to specific trainings, referral sources, etc.
- O Access resources on shared database
- Position Consortium as an expert in substance use treatment delivery within this community
- Engage a diverse range of stakeholders interested in improving recovery outcomes in M&M counties and throughout the state

Poll on additional objectives:
