Introductions:

Attendees introduced themselves and the agencies they represent.

Standing Coalition Business:

- *Approval of November minutes
 - Dalus made a motion to approve November minutes.
 - Danielle seconded the motion.

*In-Person coalition meetings

- Most members like the idea of in person but due to travel would probably attend more via Zoom
- Most members also like the hybrid idea
- The council previously voted to do in-person meetings quarterly with Zoom available on the alternating months.
- We previously tossed around the idea of having a quarterly meeting in each of our ROSC counties (i.e. one in Hamilton, Gallatin, Saline and White every year).

SIU SOM ETHIC Program (Ending Transmission of HIV, HCV, STD's and Overdose in Rural Communities) – Trevor Thompson/Wiley Jenkins

• 121 participants

**114 white/Caucasian, 6 black, 1 other – 104 straight/heterosexual, 17 queer or non-heterosexual – 48 females, 73 males – Median age is 38

Drug Use

- **24 identified heroin as a drug of choice 11 identified street fentanyl as drug of choice 95 identified methamphetamines as drug of choice
- The ETHIC grant is an over the phone process so travel is not usually necessary however, incentives are given to participants and the Community Action Place partner can travel to meet participants if needed. Coupon codes are also available for referrals.

SAFE FAMILIES FOR CHILDREN – Presentation: Tammy Samples

- Safe Families for Children Southern Illinois offers help and support to families in crisis. We can
 provide safe hosting for kids in our volunteer host homes. This is especially helpful for parents who are
 in recovery and/or wanting to receive treatment for substance use disorder and care for their children is a
 barrier. We can help families who are homeless, need mental health services, have substance
 use/domestic violence/medical needs, and other needs.
- Our volunteers are trained, background checked, fingerprinted, and homes are safety checked. Hosting is
 short-term and parents retain all legal rights. We have parents sign a legal power of attorney granting
 consent for our host families to take the child to the doctor or enroll them in school if necessary. The
 hosting can be ended at any time if parents request to have their children back although, if it is an
 unsafe situation, we will make a hotline call to DCFS. Our goal is to keep children from going into
 foster care and keep families together.
- We also offer mentoring-type services for parents who may not need hosting but could use some encouragement and mentoring to help them as they navigate the daily life of parenting.
- We have a resource closet that can help host families and parents with clothing, diapers, equipment, etc. We are always recruiting new volunteers (host families, family friends, resource friends) and always need more. NARCAN/NALOXONE/OVERDOSE REPORT, FENTANYL TEST STRIPS: Chris Dennis

- Fentanyl test strips are now available at EHD.
- Since June 2021, 35 mobile Narcan events were held in 22 counties with 916 naloxone kits being distributed.
- November 2021 numbers: 16 participants trained and 96 kits distributed.

SIH SUPPORT GRANT and CHNA Summary - Angie Bailey/Danielle Begeske

- CHNA- Behavioral health is the main focus. Once all the data is compiled, it will be put on the website tentatively set for April 2022
- SIH has Narcan available
- There is a MedSafe disposal unit at Herrin Hospital, St. Joseph's Hospital, Carbondale Memorial and the SIH Cancer Treatment Center. Now that SIH has merged with Harrisburg Medical Center, they are going to add a disposal option at this location in the future. Community members can bring unused, outdated medications and drop them in the container without having to wait for a designated annual Drug Takeback Day event.
