Agenda Topic 3 – Recovery Care Organizations (RCOs) Time allotted: 37 Ty Bechel Minutes Introduction to Recovery Care Organizations (RCO) and how to build a peer Presentation and workforce: Discussion o RCOs is typically an independent nonprofit organization led and governed by representatives of local communities of recovery. RCOs organize recovery-focused policy and advocacy activities, increase recovery workforce capacity and expertise through training and education, carry out recovery-focused outreach programs, conduct recovery-focused public and professional education events, provide peer recovery support services, support development of recovery support institutions, host local, regional, national recovery celebration events, collaborate on integration of recovery-focused activities with local prevention, harm reduction, early intervention and treatment initiatives. o Important to have boots on the ground, get to meet people, see what is really going on, talk to family members. o RCOs provide nonclinical services and do not bill insurance. No sliding scale and most services are free. o Amare started in March of 2015 with the focus on the individual, family, and community, but it was not an RCO right away. Started to focus heavily on community outreach to fill the gap that other organizations were not able to reach. Use DAST10 and SBIRT. Focus on warm handoff and do not take referrals o Amare organizes Rock and Recovery concert in September for National Recovery Month. Faces and Voices of Recovery.org offers consultation services to help build RCOs. 10 RCO Best Practices (From Faces and Voices of Recovery website): 1. Nonprofit status 2. Led and governed by the recovery community. 50% of advisory board needs to be in recovery and need to have a voice – teach them governance and nonprofit 501c3 status. 3. Primary focus is recovery from substance use disorders. 4. Grassroots, boots on the grown to get to know community. The goal is to make things better for the community. 5. Participatory process: listening and including the community.

6. Peer recovery support services.

- 7. All pathways toward recovery: not just 12-steps groups but also other recovery groups: refuge recovery, recovery dharma, smart recovery, volunteering, exercising.
- 8. Diverse equitable and inclusive polices, practices, and services.
- 9. Recovery-friendly language.
- 10. Code of ethics and grievance polices. Ensure Board of Directors is dependable.
- The state of IL is starting to fund RCOs. Can have one or two recovery homes and be an RCOs to provide peer recovery services.
- How to develop a peer workforce: prayer, fundraising experience, good mentors, figuring out a stipend with Recoverycorps and Americorps, include henefits
- O Showed video interview on domestic violence and the cycle of abuse.
