Presentation and Discussion	 Introduction and background – lived experience and published writer, currently pursuing a clinical MSW in substance use disorders treatment at Washington University. Language matters and both shapes and upholds attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors. Strengthen community action through awareness and support, critical to fight shame and stigma. Guidelines for health promotion: 5th-8th grade reading level Leave enough white space and do not use images that may be triggering Use person-first language (focus on person, not their illness). Do not use "addict" but instead "someone with a substance use disorder." Separate individuals from their addiction. Checklist for messaging:

- Reflect on where you are getting your information, how the language is framing the population and if are you inserting your personal biases.
- Reframe the conversation through messaging. How can the language foster positive values like compassion, empathy, self-worth, selfefficacy?
- Listen to stakeholders and let them weigh in on how to use language to change attitudes and promote dialogue.
- Brainstorming activity: write about messages you want to come from this ROSC. Pass the idea to the person next to you so that they can build off it. Common themes were:
 - Substance use is a disease, not a choice
 - Recovery looks different for everyone
 - We all have implicit biases and need to work on them
 - Organize community events around stigma reduction and sober living
 - Help is available, you are not alone
 - Reaching out for help is a sign of strength
 - Sobriety is only as strong as our support systems
 - Focus on long-term solutions
 - Recovery in Macoupin and Montgomery includes all of us
 - Educate all members at all levels of lived experiences on the importance of ending the stigma surrounding substance use disorders Educate schools and organizations
 - Centralize efforts to create network of resources
 - Involving law enforcement is essential
- Key words: achievable, network, encourage, community, housing, hope, no jail, opportunity, connection, process, education. All these can be used in your messaging strategies.
