  - Vision and mission There is a need in DuPage County for sober housing but education and advocacy is the biggest thing because the people in DuPage county are not so sold on the idea so collaboration is very important to help break down the stigma.
  - We want to build a culture of recovery; we want to do this by building a healthy community of productive and positive individuals.

Our council make up members include. Hospitals, Treatment Centers, Mental Health Facilities, First Responders, Recovery Programs, Schools, Local Government, Employment Agencies, and importantly persons with lived experience.

- We offer quarterly trainings for recovery coaching we've trained over 40 individuals in our first year.
- We cover topics on harm reduction, dual diagnosis, leadership in recovery, stigma reduction, sober living, specialized treatment for LGBTQ and more
- We offer opioid overdose kits
- We work with Just DuPage for re-entry
- We have collaborated with Serenity House to teach prevention education in the schools in DuPage County

## Our goals are to:

- 1. Partner with first responders to deploy coaches and ROSC members.
- 2. Partner with the health departments on the creation of anonymous self-serve Narcan machines at local hospitals.
- 3. Plan public events in collaboration with partner organizations visibility helps us with stigma reduction, recovery café has offered to collaborate with DuPage ROSC.
