Agenda Topic 3 – Medication Assisted Recovery

	 Program is supported by State of IL's Substance Use Prevention and Recovery Division (SUPR). Contract with HMA to lead a learning collaborative model to help jails develop systems of care for individuals with SUD, focusing on medication assisted recovery. 3 FDA approved medications: methadone, buprenorphine, naltrexone A lot of concerns about opioid use disorders – prevailing idea that MAR is substituting one drug for another. Without MAR: 65% of the incarcerated population have SUD or got into trouble because of risky substance use. Growing body of case law finding counties liable for not providing access to MAR in jails. Overdose death is the number one cause of death in jails. Overdose death is the number one cause of overdose after being released than someone from the general population. For heroin overdoses only, the likelihood of overdose death increased 74 times. A year after release, overdose death rates remained 10-18x higher. People who are not on MAR who are in recovery have very low relative dopamine levels in the brain – which increases likelihood of relapse. With MAR/MOUD: 61% decrease in overdose deaths after re-entry. 82% continued with MOUD after release. Study from RIDOC comparing data from prior to MAT program to after MAT program: the number needed to treat (NNT) to prevent a death from overdose was 11. MAR associated with increase in behavioral health treatment, decreased suicide, decreased needle-sharing and HIV, improved chronic disease control, reduced commercial sex work, increased employment. Substance use disorder treatment will reduce recidivism. MAR associated with improved jall conditions.

Currently 23 jails are involved. Have stipend /implementation grant to get it started (around \$30-50K).
