3. Presentation- Mike Tyson from Take Action Today RCO (Recovery Community Organizations) extremely important information

Started in West Frankfurt after a homeless man passed away

Almost 100% of the organization is peer led

Mike is a survivor of sexual trauma, the juvenile system, substance use, homelessness and is in recovery for over 24 years now. Even after experiencing relapse. He went back to college to receive degrees. He is a husband, father, college graduate and serves on several councils.

He began Take Action Today in 2019 with a grassroots community action group.

In Spring of 2020 they became incorporated.

In Fall of 2021 they hired their first time staff

They are a faith based organization opened at a city center for hope & renewal.

Meet people where they are.

Partner with community organizations already established.

Create relationships

Better to draw support in our community. Empowering recovery community

Work Social Media

Accountable to Recovery community above all else!

Providing peer based leadership, training people in recovery to be successful.

They employ 15 full time people, 4 certified peer recovery coaches, 3 resource centers.

7 different resources-food, laundry services

An RCO is an independent 501C3 direct lived experience organization, Recovery from substance use.

What we do-peer support, education and advocacy

A process of change through which individuals improve their health and wellness, live a self direct life and strive to reach their full potential. Health, Home, Purpose, Community, Leaders & community change agents.

Recovery is the expectation, not the exception. Built on principles of inclusivity, support and collaboration with the goal of reducing stigma.

4. Narcan training for businesses in 2023? Motomart Narcan boxes (Monique share) -working with the local owner of Motomart to put Narcan boxes in restroom or somewhere in the building. Conversation went so well that he would like to do this in all 85 stores that he owns in southern Illinois. We will be helping him with contacts in other counties. Very exciting news.
