Logan and Mason County have many resources but have some gaps that need to be filled. Below is a list of community resources that are available and a list of gaps in both communities. In fiscal year 23, we interviewed 17 key informants from the Logan/Mason ROSC Council. The interviews were completed with representatives from the following community sectors: law enforcement, faith-based organizations, behavioral health/substance use treatment providers, and people with lived experiences (PLEs). One hundred percent of the key informants stated that substance use was an issue in their community.

The biggest concerns were lack of recovery supports, lack of resources or services for mental health and substance use support in the community, lack of public transportation, lack of access to recovery housing, and stigma around substance use and mental health. Educating the community, speaking openly about mental health and substance use, supporting collaboration amongst providers, increasing awareness of current services, and advocating for additional local mental health and SUD treatment services are things the ROSC council will continue to do. With the lack of access to local support group meetings, the ROSC council will continue to support and provide any materials that would be needed to start up any group (i.e. books, flyers, etc..). Host monthly ROSC council meetings and post them on YouTube, and host guest speakers to increase awareness. We will continue to advocate for improved transportation options with the community government because of the lack of access to public transportation. With the lack of MAR services and wraparound services, the ROSC council will continue to advocate and educate on the need for MAR services and wraparound services. Oxford House is a great resource that we will continue to stay connected with, and we will also advocate for the need to add more recovery housing with city officials. As Logan and Mason continue to grow with multiple pathways to recovery groups, we will continue to raise awareness of existing meetings and support organizations, work to keep the information updated, and purchase materials that are needed to start up a group. In both Logan and Mason County, stigma around recovery is a community problem, along with the denial that there is a community problem. The ROSC council will continue to focus on person-centered language, engaging in community events, and disseminating information through multiple outlets (social media, flyers, etc..) to help break that stigma in both counties.
