
Introductions & Agency Updates:

- Today's meeting was recorded and started with introductions and agency updates were also moved to the front end. Not every attendee had an update but those who did are captured below:
- Kari announced that **CCE** (**Center for Community Engagement**) is launching its Faith in Recovery initiative this month so look for information about upcoming events and activities in this realm.
- Livingston County is currently involved in **Toy Drive** with Salvation Army (Partnership), and reorganizing the planning sub-committee going into the new year.


- Carrie announced that **Gateway** (Carrie and Sandra serve Piatt and Ford Counties) will be opening up a facility in Bloomington with services starting on Jan 1 2024.
- Dave King (with Carle Hospital) announced they (Vermillion County) are utilizing grant dollars
 and putting together 100 'Overdose Awareness' kits (resource bags); there are two kits—1 for
 people currently using substances and another for first responders. The goal is to have natural
 conversation about Harm Reduction with the people most affected. Also, we are close to hiring a
 Substance Use Navigator for Hoopeston, IL. We are focusing more on people with lived
 experience (as we all are) and there is word of a ROSC coming to Champaign County, per David
 King.
- Dave also shared an anecdote about recent event to give out Narcan boxes to local recoverees.
 The event itself (as planned) yielded one attendee, but the team adapted and decided to go set up their table/booth at a local cannabis dispensary, which was welcoming. As a result, they were able to hand out 75 additional kits!
- Brightpoint: Abby shared there is an opening for a Therapist (Masters degree, licensed or unlicensed) who is passionate about working with families and children. Covers all 5 counties (Liv, Ford, McLean, Woodford, and ___). Counseling and Case Management for children and families exposed to domestic violence.
- Community Action Light-Heat Program: Starts December 1st and taking all applications. It doesn't matter if elderly, disabled, or what the situation. Priority groups will be served first per IL mandate. Participants just need to be income-eligible and can set up any kind of payment plan. Odell also talked about family kits they're handing out (laundry pods, TP, diapers if needed, wipes, body wash, and basic household items and toiletries we use products we would want to use ourselves). The challenge is that people are refusing the bags out of pride (or other reasons). Odell asked for help reaching out to explain these are for "rainy days" and unexpected expenses that come up. They are not handouts for the sake of making us feel like we did something good. These kits have over \$80 of real value that can help people who are struggling financially.

Main Discussion – Deliverables:

- Gap Analysis: Frankie was walked the council through the Gap Analysis, which is a new state
 deliverable required from the ROSC. These gaps stem from the original Community Needs
 Assessment done back in 2019 and accounts for updates and changes to strategies and
 objectives along the way. The following screenshot outlines the primary gaps that have been
 identified by surveys, breakout groups, council Slido voting, and more. Transportation, Lack of
 Treatment facilities locally, Stigma Reduction, and Recovery Housing were the primary gaps
 identified.
- Frankie shared it is a 'massive goal' to try and expand on our public Transportation services;
 extend current Harm Reduction services as well (start small in Ford County to build momentum –
 e.g. test strips and Narcan cabinets in key areas), and Stigma Reduction remains an issue for any
 ROSC coalition, including Ford County.

• Asset Mapping: Frankie also talked about the Asset Map (below), which is a large flowchart-type diagram (a little too unwieldy to share via Zoom or read well, but we tried). The QR code below will take you to the fully-viewable document, which is published out on the Ford County Virtual Resource Page (Jotform)...along with all the other deliverables reviewed last month and today with the council. The Asset Map basically illustrates what services or recovery capital we currently have in place across key stakeholder areas (MAR Providers, MH Providers, Law Enforcement, Support Groups, etc.).



- Please scan the Virtual Resource App above to view a full size (or download) Asset Map for Ford County on your phone or devices.
- We want to be more inclusive and include mental health diagnoses and co-occurring disorders. There are many people seeking recovery with undiagnosed mental health illnesses, which can be a huge impediment, especially when recoveree is unaware of the condition.
- Communication & Outreach Plan: Please feel free to check out these documents
 through the QR codes (also a little too large to review 'live' with a large group). Please
 provide feedback to the team or ask questions. The Communication Plan outlines how
 ROSC will communicate its values, missions, and other related activities. The Outreach
 Plan is an overview of how ROSC is working towards engaging the Ford County
 community to address strategic plan goals and priorities.
- Strategic Plan: Frankie did not walk the group through the full document due to its length (see
 QR code below if curious/interested), but she did spotlight some of the key updates and findings
 from recent meetings and brainstorming sessions. The majority of discussion centered around
 the third item below (Inform and Engage the Community to Increase Awareness & Reduce
 Stigma around SUD/COD/MH substance use, co-occurring, and mental health disorders.



Other ROSC Updates:


- We used to have an Outreach Sub-committee in the earlier days of the Ford ROSC. It seemed to lose some momentum over time though and was eventually disbanded. Frankie is starting a new sub-committee (Workgroup) for the third goal above (Stigma Reduction): "Inform and Engage the Community to Increase Awareness and Reduce Stigma around SU/MH".
