Kristen Dean kicked off the meeting with our welcome and prayer. She had everyone go around the room and introduce themselves including name and organization and one thing they are looking forward to over Christmas. A lot of rest was said, we moved on to our presentation of all we have done with events this year or contributed too. Events like our Movie and Mind, Celebrate Families Walk a thon, Love and Grief Care and many many other events we have held and or contributed to. This comprehensive summary highlights the diverse range of topics discussed during the recovery council meeting, showcasing a collective effort to address mental health, addiction, and the importance of support systems. The meeting covers various themes, including the need for Narcan distribution in schools, reflections on accomplishments, mental health awareness events, and discussions on combating stigma in mental health for men.

Narcan Distribution and Marketing:

- Emphasis on effective communication and marketing strategies for mandatory Narcan distribution in schools in Illinois.

Mental Health Awareness Initiatives:

- Launch of virtual panels and immersive dance conferences by Director Neesha Stringfellow to educate youth and families on mental health and suicide prevention. Collaboration and County Impact:
- Collaboration between Speaker 1's nonprofit, Heartlight Ministries, Sound Minds, and the donation of proceeds to support recovery and ministries globally.

Reaching Gen Z and Combating Stigma:

- emphasizes reaching the Gen Z community and experienced therapists discuss combating mental health stigma, especially for men from diverse backgrounds. Role Modeling and Emotional Support:
- Discussions on being a good role model for children, addressing the lack of emotional support for young men, and the impact of stigma on seeking help.

Encouraging Men to Seek Help:

- Encouragement for men to express emotions, seek help, and normalize therapy as a viable option.

Therapeutic Approaches and Challenges:

- Insights from therapists on language use, validation, and affirmation in therapy, and the potential for reinforcing harmful dynamics in relationships.

Family Dynamics and Addiction:

- Exploration of the role of family members in addiction, the impact of growing up with addiction, and personal stories to build trust with clients.

Breakdown of Traditional Masculinity:

- Emphasizing the importance of men sharing experiences to challenge traditional notions of masculinity.

Recognizing Signs and Seeking Support:

- Concerns about recognizing signs of depression in men, the importance of asking the right questions, and seeking help from mental health professionals and peers.
- . Sharing Personal Experiences:
- Personal stories shared by various speakers, including experiences with mental health, loss, addiction, and the importance of sharing to reduce stigma.

Peer Support and Certification Opportunities:

- Recognition of peer specialist training completion and the importance of spreading the word about certification opportunities.

Breaking Stigma and Building Trust:

- Our Speakers stress the need for more open conversations to break the stigma around men showing emotion, vulnerability, and building trust through honesty. Future Discussions and Support:
- Suggestions for more conversations, larger panel discussions, and creating spaces to address mental health stigma.
