Vawnshekia discussed the mission and vision of Three Cords Strong which consists of supporting communities and families dealing with substance use challenges and/or disorders. Recovery is a lifelong journey that looks different for everyone. Everyone's personal journey should be respected.

- Participants spoke about unconventional pathways to recovery.
 - Internet based recovery support such as TikTok.
 - Affect (App Based)-pays you to complete 12-Step Program
 - A Bridge Back (Program)-provides 3 months of rental assistance.
- Officer Harris provided information about seeking the Faith Liaison officers with CAPS in each Police District.
- Officer Harris also suggested connecting with the 2nd District CAPS/CPD
- Dalton Brown from the Felony Free Society (Non-Profit) works with youth to keep them off drugs and away from activities that can result to Felonies. Mr.
 Brown stated that people/parents are not aware of resources and explained that Social Media can be used to engage and provide information to parents to help the youth.
- Pastor Don (Trauma Healing Specialist) stated that communities/individuals need to look at why people use (drugs) to take the focus away from pain. Pastor Don's curriculum is taught worldwide and used in 39 countries as well as in jails.
- Johanna Gonzalez (IDHS)- compliments the outreach efforts to the community and the success of collaborating with local Police Officers. Ms. Gonzalez stated that the ROSC coalition is a council made up of community members using what they have to make the community a better place especially for our citizens with substance use challenges, mental health challenges and/or disorders.

Brainstorm Ideas for What's Next?

Officer Harris suggested that the council members begin speaking to their neighbors. Officer Harris shared how he uses his job to connect people with services.

The participants shared ideas of what they would like to strengthen the community:

- Food giveaways and youth outreach.
- Collaborate with schools to educate the youth about preventive measures with before and after school programs such as DARE, YMCA, Sunshine, Lost Boys and Project Hood.
- Make connections with schools and principals.

Vawnshekia closed the meeting re-iterating the way a coalition works and the expectations for those in the counsel. As a coalition, our focus is on providing lifelong support and coming up with solutions ourselves!

Finally, Vawnshekia mentions action-steps such as: signing up to become apart or gain more info of ROSC using the QR code; joining our next meeting February 29, 2024 at 9:30 AM (Same Zoom link for those online), inviting people they know to join the ROSC, volunteering to pass out info; and helping to collect survey info.

Johanna Gonzalez presented a question for the participants/stakeholders to reflect:

What kind of work do you need help with that a ROSC can help with?
