Mission/Situation Statement:

"Collaborating to build and empower communities of recovery." There is a lack of understanding in the counties we serve that "recovery happens within the community." The development of a collaborating Recovery Oriented System of Care will work to create a culture that builds and nurtures recovery.

Vision

- People can and do recover
- Individuals and families determine the supports and services they need.
- Services and supports are continuous, cohesive across different phases of care and are coordinated across the various agencies involved in their delivery.
- Support of recovery is a community responsibility and value.
- There is inherent flexibility in the system so it can be responsive to different pathways to recovery.
- Measuring quality and outcomes is a system priority.

Values

- Recognize the right of a person to direct their own recovery and that there are many models of, and paths to, recovery
- Operate with integrity and a sense of personal responsibility
- Include the "voice" of peers, family members, and the community in planning and decision-making
- Implement programs with competency and good stewardship
- Empower individuals and families
- Embrace cultural diversity

Goals:

To collaborate with community service providers and supports regarding the following:

- Recognizing that Substance Use Disorders (SUDs) and Mental Health Afflictions are chronic in nature that requires an active process of "recovery."
- A reduction in stigma associated with those struggling with SUDs and MH
- Defining vocabulary that communicates the pain of experiencing a biophysical brain disorder rather than equating substance use with moral weakness.
- Details of public policy and practice that can support recovery in crucial ways.
- Developing commitment to implement and sustain a recovery-oriented system of care

Objectives:

- Individuals are empowered to collaborate with professionals, peers, and other formal service providers to direct their own recovery to the greatest extent possible.
 - Personalized recovery regimen, education, employment, reduced criminal justice involvement, stability in housing, improved health, social connectedness, quality of life
- Community providers will offer a broad range of supports to meet the holistic needs of the individuals.
 - Increased access and capacity, proper placement and quality of care, retention, perception of care, cost-effectiveness, and use of evidence-based practices
