

Please be informed that the Faculty of Fine Arts and Music is available only for students whose field of study is either fine art or music. Faculty of Medicine accepts limited number of students. Nominations for General Medicine may be sent also in April for the Spring semester of the next academic year.			
Application procedure	When a student is officially nominated by his/her home institution, the student is instructed to access the UO application system. The application is processed online. Mandatory uploads are (no hard copies needed): (1) Copy of passport. (2) Copy of English Language Proficiency. (3) Unofficial copy of student's transcript. (4) For Faculty of Fine Arts and Music: a portfolio or a music record

ESTIMATED COSTS OF LIVING

Please note that all costs below are subject to change without prior notice.

Housing	3 000 – 6 000 CZ	(135 - 270 USD)
Meals	6 200 CZK (280 USD)	Subsidized student meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner) are available at the restaurants within the Jan Opletal Halls of Residence and Kampus Palace.
Transportation	300 – 650 CZK (14 - 60 USD)	ODIS card (public transport card) - a ticket valid for 1, 3 or 5 months uploaded to a public transport card; price depending on the kind of selected travel zone; for students up to 26 years old.

Buddy system

All international students may ask to be assigned to a "buddy" who will help them to adjust smoothly to the life and culture of the Czech Republic.

The buddies usually pick up the international students at the train station in Ostrava and take them to the accommodation. The buddy system is operated by the international student club ESN Ostravská (www.esn-ostravska.cz/buddy).

Students may register to this service usually within one month before their arrival to Ostrava using a registration link sent by a Buddy Coordinator via email.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY

Accommodation scholarship

International students have a possibility to apply for an accommodation scholarship before the set deadline.

The students must study a full quarter at the university

and be physically in the Czech Republic.

Student must also have a Czech bank account.

More information may be required after arrival to Ostrava at the specific UO faculty.
