Back to the basics, what is Community Coalition? Community toolbox, CADCA

Fostering collaborations and maximize combined strengths and resources

ROSC Council focuses on big picture, speak on importances of the ROSC being its own entity, trainings for everyone.

(IDHS-SUPR)- Coalition outreach- coalition outreach coalition engagement

Direct service activities: support groups, providing transportation, one on one recovery support coaching, sober social events, etc.

Greg Santori wondering how transportation works

Jon shares on his supports of transportation: direct communication, referrals, if there's availability, two per one person method, waivers, signing contract that there are no substances in the vehicle, TASC (Greg Santori) covers- Montgomery, Macoupin, Greene, Calhoun, jersey counties.

Lindsay Kidd wondering how people get transportation services for TASC or NN, Jon explains the requirements of how to get services through NN,

Michelle: As for Planning Committee- carissa shared on the ROSC strategic plan updates. The goals are increasing engagement in ROSC council increase access to housing, increase transportation, reduce stigma, promote and support peer workforce, work with criminal justice system, proposed increase prevention efforts especially among youth.

Brittany: prevention and SUD in youth in il is little to nothing, we need more engagement with that.

The main goal with the Planning Committee by September will be adding at least 1 person each quarter, and retain attendance, someone in our council to create a faith-based alliance to help with more in the community.

Patrick miller started speaking on wanting to engage more with that.

Someone from the council mentioned Zion Lutheran wanting to get more involved with ROSC consortium. Many churches want to be involved, methodist churches to be more involved, methodist church in Greenville want to be mental health first aid trained.

Elyse shared on housing- work with Institute of Rual affairs Western il university complete stock survey, council members utilize PREPARE if possible.

Michelle: the Madison County Coordinated Response team has discovered HMIA for Montgomery and Macoupin, and Trudy Bogenboch will speak on it in November. For the Planning Committee there will also be by September 2025 continued research for grant funding for housing and transportation. NN, Hope/Emotion transportation prog in Montgomery and MCPHD-T, referrals with NN, sit on central IL transit transportation committee, with NN to sustain the program.

Jon: NN wants to expand into different areas for more help, getting another vehicle possibly, there's threshold and barriers to different transportation businesses

Elyse: MCP-T has put emergency funds for transportation, what about churches in the area? With correct training it is possible to get people from congregations to help with transport.

MCPHD went for a grant for peer support, wherever they are needed, and Montgomery co bought a small bus seeing if needed to use as transport.

Lauren: Crossover ministries will be having a parade or float to support recovery, partnering with Celebrate Recovery, Haven Home of Hope, and they are looking for volunteers.

Michelle: As far as the sector for criminal justice, there will be more engagement with more justice partners and engage law enforcement.

Increase prevention efforts- youth is experiencing higher rates of mental health issues

Establish a youth prevention advisory council, will organize on event, strategy, MCPHD school health eds and ROSC coord will facilitates youth prevention advisory and help youth brainstorm potential event opportunities.

Bailey Jarmen: youth prevention specialist, we will be having a safety-first anti-drug curriculum, encourage youth to abstain but factor harm reduction added in, peer pressure, opioids, new mandate in 2024-2025 school years school administration have to teach prevention on fentanyl to students. For anyone wondering, the house bill is 3924, active Jan 1st. It's meant to provide education through schools for prevention and discussion of fentanyl in schools, and we are looking into expanding the grant into Montgomery County.

By 2025 increase ROSC members understanding of prevention, engage social media efforts, create outreach packages, etc.

Tricha with NAMI, youth program coordinator- has youth prevention program, ending the silence, positive counts, brings therapy dogs into schools' social skill, mental health, a contact to get into schools.

Peggy Fox is the prevention specialist in Montgomery schools.
