Presentation

Nellie Paskavich presented a PowerPoint covering survey data and gap analysis results. Focus was placed on aligning future strategies for coalition growth and long-term sustainability.

Based on the analysis of community survey responses, several key gaps have emerged from this assessment. Among the most critical areas are:

- Access to Mental Health Services A significant portion of respondents identified inadequate
 access to mental health care as a primary concern. Barriers such as lack of local providers and
 affordability issues were mentioned.
- Transportation Barriers Lack of reliable transportation was repeatedly cited as a challenge in accessing treatment, recovery services, and even basic healthcare. Enhancing transportation support—through partnerships, ride programs, or funding initiatives—can directly improve access to care.
- 3. Stigma and Community Education The survey indicates persistent stigma around mental health and substance use, which acts as a barrier to individuals seeking help. Community-wide education efforts and lived experience storytelling should be prioritized to foster empathy and understanding.
- 4. Harm Reduction Awareness and Access While support for harm reduction exists, access to resources like naloxone and overdose education is limited or poorly understood. Expanding harm reduction outreach, training, and visibility is a key step in saving lives and reducing stigma.
- 5. Youth and Prevention Services Responses show a notable concern about the lack of prevention programs for youth related to mental health and substance use. The ROSC Council can play a

pivotal role in partnering with schools and youth-serving organizations to build proactive, ageappropriate programming.
