Tammy Stewart's Presentation

- Sinnissippi covers 5 counties in Illinois and hoping to open more offices
- We were founded in 1966 after the de-institutionalization of the 60s that closed many mental health institutions. The value then was put in community care.
- We have 300 staff, and we cover many different areas of recovery and mental health.
- In 2020, we applied for a federal grant called CCBHC
 - o Called the Expansion grant. We received a million dollars over the course of 3 years to increase the peer workforce among other things.
- We then applied for the Innovation and Advancement Grant (IA Grant) to further the work of CCBHC
 - This helped us bring in primary care nurse practitioners and a full-time medical director.

Questions from both meetings:

How does this add to or change Sinnissippi?

As mentioned, it is the accessibility that stands out. We are developing an assessment team to help with intakes. Working on a same-day access model, meeting people where they're at. From there, we can connect people quickly to our peer network. Peer coordination will also improve and increase. We will also have a care navigator to ensure that proper care is being administered.

Does residency matter with our intakes? Can people from other counties be part of this? Anybody who comes to our CCBHC will be served regardless of residence.

How many Psychologists and Psychiatrists do you staff?

We currently have 4 psychiatrists, and 1 medical director, and 1 of the prescribers is our MAR prescriber. They have almost same-day access. Have dedicated blocks to help recently discharged peers within 30 days of their discharge.
