3. Presentation-NAMI- Heather Kapp

Heather shared about her lived experience with mental health issues. Citing after the passing of her father, she suffered from extreme depression and agoraphobia, a condition of mental health that keeps people confined to their home. Heather has since, used mental health resources that have allowed her to begin a new job as outreach specialist for Nami-National Alliance Mental Illness and attend classes at SUIE for CRSS/CPRS certificates. Heather shared Nami's most current resources per her role and expressed how she would like to build a team of stakeholders through the BCRC and others whom work with people who face mental illness and substance use disorder.

Heather created Nami-At-Work which builds relationships with business leaders in the community. Heather provides a created pamphlet of resources, referring it to a mental health dose of medicine, which she gives to an employer who then shares with any employee he recognizes with mental health concerns. The pamphlet contains a wealth of information that will lead people to where to find help.

Nami has two types of support groups, Nami Connect, which is open to anyone with mental health diagnosis or struggles. This group is created as a safe place to talk. Nami Family Support is a supportive group that focuses on any family member of a loved one with mental illness.

The 2nd & 4th Saturday of each month, there is a Nami Woman's Group, where women with mental health issues attend to share and talk safely

All meeting times & dates will be included in flyers sent.

Nami shares support, education and advocacy for mental health community. May is mental health awareness month and Nami is promoting a Mental Health Online Raffle which costs \$5 or \$10 per chance to win an exciting gift.

PAWSITIVITY: Nami presents 3 service dogs to schools, hospitals, juvenile detention homes and other organizations to help bring mental wellness to clients

Nami will also host a Walk on September 20th and is currently looking for businesses to sponsor.
