About LC ROSC

Northern Illinois Recovery Community Organization is the lead agency driving the system of care transformation. The system encompasses multiple sector partners including substance use and mental health providers, persons with lived experience, family members, law enforcement, judicial personnel, faith base organizations, community organizers and local colleges.

What is ROSC

Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC) is a coordinated network of community-based services and supports that is person-centered and builds on the strengths and resilience of individuals, families, and communities to experience recovery and improve health, wellness, and quality of life for those with or at risk of substance use and/or co-occurring conditions. The central focus of a ROSC is to create an infrastructure, or “systems of care”, with the resources to effectively address the full range of substance use and/or co-occurring disorders within communities

ROSC Goals

While each ROSC Council will utilize unique methods that resonate with their communities, ROSC work can be summarized into addressing three core goals:

- Create a culture that builds and nurtures recovery.
- Build capacity and infrastructure to support a recovery-oriented systems of care.
- Develop commitments to implement and sustain the work.

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
