II. Overview of Goal 3 of FY25 McLean County ROSC Strategic Plan

Cat Hays outlined the third strategic plan goal, which aims to enhance service delivery by expanding agency partnerships and increasing access to recovery support services. The objectives include addressing location-based barriers,



fostering community engagement, and promoting awareness of recovery services.

- a. Goal 3: Ensure Effective Service Delivery
 - i. Goal #1: Expand the number of agencies with established MOUs to improve service delivery, increasing participation by 10% (Ongoingly, FY26+)
 - Objective A: Expand access to recovery support services by addressing location-based barriers to accessing services and resources, advocating for additional peer recovery services, and developing comprehensive referral networks to ensure continuity of of care across healthcare and treatment settings.
 - 2. Objective B: Strengthen community partnerships and engagement to enhance the delivery of recovery services by fostering crosssector collaborations; integrating recovery support into community life; and building sustainable, transparent communication channels that involve individuals with lived experience, local leaders, and service providers in joint initiatives aimed at increasing access to substance use and co-occurring disorder resources.
 - 3. Objective C: Expand and strengthen awareness and promotion of recovery resources to improve accessibility and engagement.
