Top 3 Priorities

Increasing Recovery Resources

- Hosted 17 free Laundry Days serving 200+ people
- Assisted a PLE with starting a new recovery meeting in Shelby County
- Hosted 4 peer-led recovery education groups weekly (2 in each county)
- Hosted our 2nd Annual Candlelight Vigil with 18 attendees
- Hosted our first Family Move and Groove with 13 attendees
- Partnered with CEFS Community Action Agency and SCCS (Shelby County Community Services) to host our Spring into Recovery event which served 90+ people
- Partneres with Dove Inc. to host Summer Vibes & Community Tides event



General Stigma Reduction

- Launched our 12-month Anti-Stigma Communication Campaign: WE CAN & DO RECOVER
- Partnered with Prevention First and Effingham County ROSC for a Youth Engagement Panel
- Recovery Navigator shared her story with freshman health class at Okaw Valley High School
- Recovery Navigator shared her story with senior class in Shelby County
- Introduced ROSC to the town of Lovington by attending their Community MAPPING events
- Participated in a series of radio ads for recovery month

Reducing Harm Reduction Stigma

- Successfully obtained Opioid Settlement Funds from the Shelby County Board to further harm reduction efforts
- 398 boxes of Narcan were distributed through trainings, events, and DOPP sites
- We had 15 total Drug Overdose Prevention Program sites
- We added 5 new DOPP sites
- Barney Narcan Newstand placed at HSHS Good Shepherd Hospital
- Narcan training at Moultrie County Counseling Center
- Coordinator attended MAR Symposium to bring information back to Moultrie County Jail
