



Engaged Community Partners

This year, SRC collaborated with over 80 cross-sector partners, including its partner agencies, member agencies such as Proactive Community Services, South Suburban Council on Alcoholism, Ingalls Hospital, and NAMI South Suburbs. Monthly ROSC Council meetings and quarterly pop-up events fostered collaboration with faith-based groups, local health departments, and peer-led organizations, strengthening our regional recovery ecosystem.



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Re-established quarterly in-person ROSC Council meetings, participated in podcasts, and hosted live events to amplify recovery voices
