
FY25 IMPACT REPORT

Harm reduction services play a critical role in reducing stigma by meeting people where they are, promoting safety, and fostering compassion in the response to substance use.

- Individuals trained to administer Narcan: 53
- Narcan kits distributed: 2263
- Overdose kits distributed: 109
- Test Strips distributed: 980
- Number of Individuals served through outreach: 603

By launching five new recovery support groups across the counties we serve we're expanding access to vital peer led resources helping to increase equity and support long term recovery in rural communities.
