- Lincoln Police Chief joined the ROSC in person for the first time and promoted our community survey, on his own, to the Lincoln City Council
- 1st Presbyterian Church members took our community survey during one of their small groups
- Deflection Initiative started in September 2024
 - o BRIDGE (Build Recovery, Inclusion, and Dignity for Growth & **Empowerment)**
 - o Goals: Build trust in law enforcement, raise mental health awareness, and promote harm reduction for recovery and stable housing
 - Focus areas: Collaboration, Stigma Reduction, Medical Care, Compassion, and Community Involvement
 - Desired outcomes: Increase attendance and diversity in recovery meetings, decrease drug-related court cases and stigma, and grow stakeholder partnerships
 - o Attendees include law enforcement, treatment providers, PLEs, Veterans Court, Drug Court, Health Department, Salvation Army, and more
