3. Organizational Spotlight / Guest Presentation

Presenter: Anthony Hooker from Parkland College

Topic: Overview of Programs offered

- Parkland has traditional certificate, degree and transfer programs but over the last ten years has changed to offer some free training programs. These programs are short so that people can get into the workforce quickly. If you are not a high school graduate these programs will help you to earn your GED as part of your training.
- SWFT (Support for Workforce Training) program offers training for in-demand fields that pay competitive wages and SWFT provides comprehensive support to help students successfully complete their training.
- Some of the other areas of training in SWFT are a six-week truck driver training (CDL), one semester Nurse Assistant (CAN) training, and a 911 Telecommunication program that is a paid two-week certification program.

- o Highway construction program is a 16-week hands on vocational program. It introduces students to different trades such as electrician, construction, masonry, and construction math. Drug testing is required in the programs that are preparing student to work as part of a union and will likely be required in the jobs out in the field. After training the students can go on to obtain good paying union jobs. The tradesman workforce is aging so this is a much-needed program because employers are looking new employees.
- Clean Air Jobs Act includes quick programs in HVAC and solar panel technician/ solar power installation.
