## • Psychiatric Hospital Services

- o 84 inpatient beds for children, adolescents, and adults.
- Open 24/7 for crisis assessments.

#### Youth Residential Program

Ages 12–19; long-term placement with secure education and housing.

### • New Choice Recovery Program

- o 28-day structured, abstinence-based program.
- 26 dedicated beds; accepts dual-diagnosis patients.
- Medical detox for heroin and alcohol; no detox for meth.
- Secure campus with monitored recreation and smoking areas.
- No registered sex offenders allowed due to youth proximity.

#### Intake Process

- o Prescreening required; patient must be voluntary and present for assessment.
- o Walk-in accepted but calling ahead preferred.
- o 800 number routes directly to assessment team no voicemail.

#### Jail Outreach:

o On pause due to facility renovations; 2 successful transitions to rehab noted.

### Hope Shelter:

o 5–6 engaged participants; strong engagement from women.

### Recovery Grub Fest (June 20):

200+ attendees; live music, food trucks, and community resources.
