Recovery Oriented Systems of Care Survey FY26

<u>DEFINITIONS</u>: The terms listed below are used throughout the survey and are provided to ensure people provide the best educated answer.

Drug Court- a specialized court program that provides individuals with substance use disorders an alternative to traditional incarceration. Instead of serving jail time, eligible participants are connected to treatment, counseling, case management, and ongoing supervision. Drug Courts aim to reduce recidivism, support recovery, and improve public safety by addressing the root causes of addiction through accountability and support.

Harm Reduction- evidence based strategies that aim to minimize the negative consequences associated with substances use, prevent overdose & infectious disease transmission, improve over-all wellbeing, & provide low-barrier access to healthcare services.

Medication-Assisted Recovery (MAR)- A recovery pathway that includes the use of FDA-approved medications, in combination with counseling and behavioral therapies, to support individuals in achieving and maintaining recovery from substance use disorders (SUD).

Narcan- (naloxone) is an over-the-counter (OTC) drug that's used to treat known or possible opioid overdose. Narcan comes as a nasal (nose) spray. Each container holds one dose of Narcan that's sprayed into one nostril.

Recovery- a process of change through which people improve their health and wellness, live self-directed lives, and strive to reach their full potential.

Recovery Supports- Recovery supports refer to a range of services and resources designed to assist individuals in their journey towards recovery from mental health or substance use disorders. These supports include: 12-step meetings, peer support services, recovery housing, etc.

ROSC- The State of Illinois defines a Recovery Oriented Systems of Care (ROSC) as a coordinated network of community-based services and supports that is person-centered.

Stigma- a mark of disgrace associated with a particular circumstance, quality, or person.

Substance Use Disorder- another phrase used for addiction to drugs or alcohol; a complex medical condition characterized by uncontrollable patterns of substances despite harmful consequences.

Syringe Program- A syringe program is a community-based service that provides people who use drugs with clean, sterile needles and a safe way to dispose of used ones. These programs are designed to prevent the spread of diseases like HIV and Hepatitis C, reduce the harms associated with drug use, and protect the health of both individuals and the community.
