## **Recovery Oriented Systems of Care (ROSC) Community Survey 2025**

## **Shelby County**

<u>PURPOSE</u>: This survey is to gauge the level of awareness of all available resources in Shelby County and measure public opinion on issues related to recovery. The information collected will be used to identify areas for improvement in our community and will remain confidential.

**<u>DEFINITIONS:</u>** The terms listed below are used throughout the survey and are provided to ensure people provide the best educated answer.

**Drug Overdose Prevention Program (DOPP) Site**- designated location in the community—such as a business, library, or community center—that hosts a public Narcan display. These sites provide free access to Narcan (naloxone), a life-saving medication that reverses opioid overdoses. Community members can take Narcan from these sites at any time, with no questions asked and no requirements to provide personal information.

**Harm Reduction-** evidence based strategies that aim to minimize the negative consequences associated with substances use, prevent overdose & infectious disease transmission, improve overall wellbeing, & provide low-barrier access to healthcare services.

**Medication-Assisted Recovery (MAR)** - A recovery pathway that includes the use of FDA-approved medications, in combination with counseling and behavioral therapies, to support individuals in achieving and maintaining recovery from substance use disorders (SUD).

**Narcan**- Narcan is a brand name for naloxone, an opioid antagonist used to reverse or reduce the effects of opioids, particularly in cases of overdose.

**Recovery-** a process of change through which people improve their health and wellness, live self-directed lives, and strive to reach their full potential

**ROSC-** is a coordinated network of community-based services and supports that is person-centered and builds on the strengths and resilience of individuals, families, and communities to achieve abstinence and improved health, wellness, and quality of life for those with or at risk of alcohol and drug problems.

**Safe Passage Program**- a voluntary program that begins when an individual requests help with a substance use disorder by calling 911, walking into police headquarters or approaching a police officer. Officers will immediately connect individuals to treatment and recovery resources. A community volunteer(s) will then transport the individual to said treatment or recovery resource.

**Substance Use Disorder**- another phrase used for addiction to drugs or alcohol; a complex medical condition characterized by chronic, uncontrollable patterns of substances despite harmful consequences.

**Syringe Service Program-** Syringe services programs are community prevention programs that provide a range of services that prevent spread of disease and protect communities. They are proven to save lives, help those with substance use disorders get needed support, prevent overdose deaths, and reduce the impact of drug use on the community.
