Equity and Inclusion Presentation BCRC 9/10/25-by Monique Brunious What is the difference between EQUALITY AND EQUITY?

Equity vs. Equality:

Equality: Giving everyone the same support.

Equity: Giving everyone the support they need to succeed.

For our strategic plan FY26, The Bond County Recovery Council- ROSC is focused on Building a More Equitable Bond County. We hope to address the disparities of housing, transportation

and food sources for those who struggle with substance use disorder and Mental Illness. This approach is necessary in Bond County because there are limited resources to provide satisfactory services to those who are on their journey of recovery.

As a council, a recovery community, our hope

Is to create County where every resident, regardless of their location, income, or background, has equitable access to the resources needed to thrive.

Why it matters:

Inclusive, equitable communities are stronger, healthier, and more prosperous for all.

The local challenge:

Our Rural Reality: Bond County faces challenges common to many other rural areas, including limited public transit, affordable housing, and food deserts. These challenges disproportionately affect specific populations, including those who struggle with mental illness and substance use disorder.

The Cost of Inaction:

Failure to address these gaps leads to poor health outcomes, economic stagnation, and increased burdens on emergency and social services.

Call to action:

Collaboration is Key:

No single organization can solve these challenges alone. It will take a collective effort from all of us. The Bond County Recovery Council and Recovery Community Need your help.

What you can do:

Participate: Join community discussions and volunteer your time and expertise Bond County Recovery Council will form an Equity and Inclusion group to brainstorm ideas and share experiences which build equitable and inclusiveness in our community. We need you to share your expertise.

Advocate: Use your voice to prioritize equity and inclusion in community planning. **Invest**: Support our local organizations and initiatives working on transportation, housing, and food security.

Advocate: Use your voice to prioritize equity and inclusion in community planning.

Here are some examples:

Equity in transportation

We are fortunate to have <u>Bond County Transit</u>, but we must ensure its services are fully accessible and meets the needs of people with substance use disorder and mental illness.

Bond County Barriers:

Many of our people with lived experience face obstacles getting to jobs, meetings, medical appointments, and grocery stores due to:

- * **Limited Transit hours:** Service ends in the mid-afternoon.
- *No evening and weekend service: Excludes those with non-traditional work schedules.
- *Last-mile gaps: Transportation service may not reach rural residences.

Ideas for Inclusion:

- *Expanded Hours: Start a program at BCT with extended weekday or limited weekend service
- *Volunteers Create partnership with non-profits and churches to volunteer driver networks. (like Free Methodist Church)
- *Coordination: Collaborate with a ride sharing service

Equity in housing

Affordable Housing Shortage: Rural Illinois often lacks affordable housing options, forcing families to choose between quality and cost. The <u>Bond County Housing Authority</u> is a vital resource, but demand often outpaces availability.

Ideas for Inclusion:

- *Partnerships: Partner with BCMW Community Services and other local groups to access state and federal housing assistance.
- *Support Homeownership: Promote USDA housing loan programs for rural residents.
- *Create a program that helps low-income homeowners with critical home repairs.

Equity in food access

Barriers to healthy food: Limited transportation and income create challenges for accessing outside grocery stores and farmers' markets.

*Food Deserts: Some rural residents live in "food deserts"
(Sorento/Pocahontas/Keyesport) with limited access to fresh, nutritious food.
*High Poverty: Bond County has a higher poverty rate than the Illinois average, impacting food security. Most of our recovery community has only a link card which is difficult to purchase food for a month since costs are so high.

Ideas for Inclusion:

- *Mobile Markets: Launch a mobile market or grocery delivery service to reach underserved areas.
- *Support Community Gardens: Invest in the United Methodist community garden as a recovery community helping nutritional food grow and/or educational programs through partnerships with Illinois Extension and 4-H. clubs.

*Strengthen Food Pantries: Help Bond County Food Pantry by getting more donations or coordinate transportation for food pantry volunteers and clients.

Conclusion:

We need the help of our stakeholders in order to achieve these goals.


