The meeting opened with ROSC Council members gathered in a small conference room to review the previous strategic plan and begin planning for upcoming pop events. Angelia Smith, Lead Fiscal Agency, spoke with small group committees on new roles and expectations for SRC moving forward in FY26. ROSC Council Meeting started at 8:41 AM and both Committee Meet Ups and the ROSC Council meeting concluded at 10:09 AM.

#### **FY26 Updates and New Councils**

The meeting began with introductions and updates from various participants, including Jerry Davis-El, who mentioned his previous work with UMARC and association with Cornerstone CDC. Yvonne and Angelia shared updates on the start of FY26 beginning July 1st and forthcoming changes and deadlines to keep in mind for September. The TA Kenneth Bell reviewed other events across the region. Angelia F. Smith made closing remarks about pop ups, obtaining additional funding and outreach/collaboration opportunities.



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Angelia F. Smith welcomed everyone to the Recovery Mini-Conference at 10:15 AM. Introductions and updates from various participants, including new roles and the excitement for the start of FY26 was expressed.

ROSC Council Members/PLEs Jasmine and Lamont led attendees through Recovery Bingo as many attendees networked while playing the game as a means to be the first to proclaim, "BINGO!" Collectively, the group discussed the growing criminal activity that is often tied to substance use; how more strides could be made to deepen recovery awareness throughout the Southland; and what target communities should be considered when planning activities.

### Southland Recovery Coalition Mini-Conference 10:00 am - Noon

#### Highlights>Guest Speaker: Jerry Davis-El, Gro Community

In this powerful and deeply personal presentation, Jerry Davis-El of GRO Community illuminated the urgent need to dismantle stigmas surrounding recovery, incarceration, and mental health. Drawing from his own lived experience—including his journey through incarceration and into sustained recovery—Davis-El offered a compelling narrative of resilience, transformation, and purpose.

He shared how GRO Community's trauma-informed programs provide culturally responsive support for justice-involved individuals, emphasizing healing, accountability, and community reintegration. Through mentorship, peer-led initiatives, and holistic care, GRO Community fosters pathways to wellness and empowerment for those often marginalized by systemic barriers. Davis-El's message was clear: stigma is not just a social burden—it's a barrier to healing. His story underscored the power of vulnerability, the necessity of second chances, and the enduring motivation to keep moving forward, not just for oneself, but for the broader community.

He further shared information about GRO Community Chicago and the organization's various locations across the country. At the root of the GRO Community, there is the desire to combat the impacts of Gun Violence in our communities. Statistics show that the leading cause of death for black males between the ages of 14 -34 is homicide through gun violence in Chicago. Jerry explained how the agency understands that mental health plays a major role in the contribution to the challenges that take place in our communities, and GRO Community serves as a catalyst for solving it.

Trizeyah and Danielle from GRO shared more information about their workforce development program and its benefits for those with lived experience and their other workforce pipeline—The Gro Community Print Shop, which is a social enterprise dedicated to producing high-quality screen-printed and promotional items. Since 2021, they have specialized in creating a wide range of products.



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### **Recovery Champion Myron Graham Remarks**

In a heartfelt moment of recognition, Myron Graham—President and CEO of the South Suburban Council on Alcoholism—accepted the 2025 Recovery Champion award from the Southland Recovery Coalition with deep gratitude and humility. His remarks reflected a profound commitment to service, rooted in a mission-driven and value-based approach that centers dignity, equity, and long-term healing.

Graham spoke candidly about the personal significance of this honor, not only as a professional milestone but as a legacy-building moment for his family. He emphasized the importance of recovery awareness and community education, expressing a powerful hope that his pre-teen son will grow up in a world where compassion replaces stigma, and where those seeking help are met with understanding, not judgment.

Under his leadership, the South Suburban Council continues to be a beacon of culturally responsive care, trauma-informed programming, and systemic advocacy. Graham's vision is clear: recovery is not just possible—it's transformative. And it begins with changing the narrative, one life, one community at a time.
